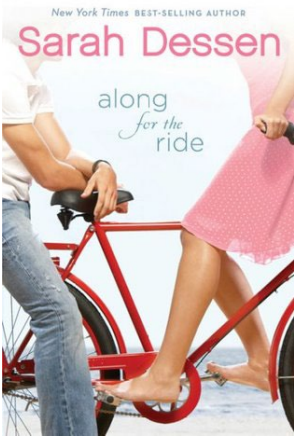


## NEW BOOKS FOR YOUNG ADULTS

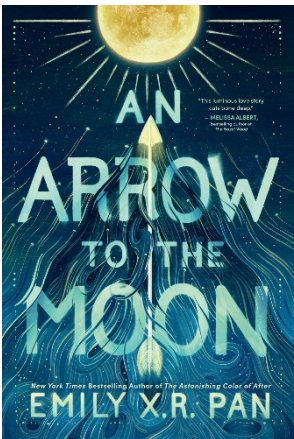


### *Along for the Ride* / Sarah Dessen

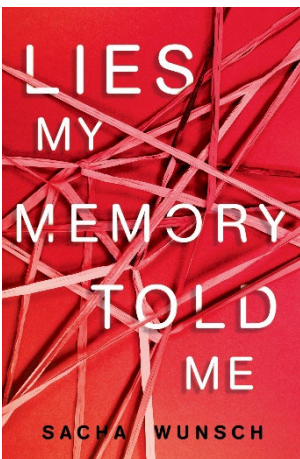

14+ years

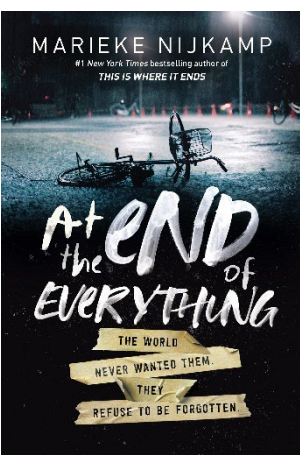
