
NOTE:

- 1. The application fee must be paid in full on lodgement to Council.
- 2. The third dog must not be kept at the subject premises until an approval is granted by Goondiwindi Regional Council.
- 3. Granting of an approval will be subject to a pre-arranged inspection of the nominated property by an authorised person of Goondiwindi Regional Council.
- 4. Three dog approvals are subject to an annual fee.
- 5. Properties with three dog approvals are inspected as part of the annual inspection program.
- 6. Should the dog, the subject of the three dog approval, not be kept on the property then the Council must be notified. Provisions exist for the registration to be transferred.
- 7. Three dog approvals relate specifically to the third dog registered to the property and cease when the dog is no longer kept on the property.

Minimum Standards for Keeping Animals Generally

A person who keeps an animal on premises must:

- 1. Ensure that the animal is adequately identified so that the owner's name, address and telephone number are readily ascertainable; and
- 2. Ensure that waste waters from enclosures are drained in a nuisance free manner and that run-off is kept off adjoining premises or as otherwise directed by an authorised person; and
- 3. Ensure that excreta, food scraps and other material that is, or is likely to become, offensive is collected at least daily and, if not immediately removed from the premises, is kept in a waste container of a kind approved by an authorised person; and
- 4. Ensure that any enclosure in which the animal is kept is properly maintained in:
 - a. a clean and sanitary condition; and
 - b. an aesthetically acceptable condition; and
 - c. take all reasonable steps to prevent the animal from causing a nuisance to the occupiers of
 - i. adjoining premises; or
 - ii. premises in the vicinity of the land on which the animal is ordinarily kept; and
 - iii. ensure that the area available to the animal kept on the premises is appropriately sized so that the animal can be effectively and comfortably kept.
- 5. All dogs must be fully vaccinated in accordance with Australian Vet Association and
- 6. Approval holder must ensure animals are registered annually with Council and
 - a. If Council receive any complaints approval can be revoked and
 - b. Approval must be kept and presented on the request of an Authorized Officer and
 - c. All dogs born, gifted or purchased after the changes to the *Animal Management Cats and Dogs Act 2009 ("AMCAD")* must be microchipped.

Requirements for Proper Enclosures for Animals

A proper enclosure is an area of the land on which the animal, regardless of species or breed, is kept, appropriately sized so as to be capable of effectively and comfortably housing the animal.

- 1. The area must be suitably fenced:
 - a. appropriate to the species and breed of the animal to be enclosed and so as to effectively enclose the animal on the land on which it is kept at all times.
 - b. enclosures are to be positioned at rear of the property and no closer than 10 meters from adjoining properties.
- 2. For the purposes of this, suitably fenced means enclosed by a fence:
 - a. constructed of materials which are of sufficient strength to prevent the animal from escaping over, under or through the fence; and
 - of a height which is sufficient to prevent the animal jumping or climbing the fence;
 and
 - c. where the animal has the ability to dig which includes a barrier installed directly below the fence to prevent the animal digging its way out; and
 - d. where the animal has the ability to climb designed and constructed in such a way as to prevent the animal from climbing over the fence; and
 - e. of which all gates are kept closed and latched except when in use by a person entering or leaving the land on which the animal is kept; and
 - f. enclosures located along common dividing fences must be suitably screened from neighbouring properties.
