The Royal Hotel at Leyburn is the oldest continually licensed establishment in Queensland. The building as it stands today incorporates the original premises, built in 1863. Every August, the town hosts about 15,000 rev heads at the Leyburn Sprints, a commemoration of the first Queensland Grand Prix held in Leyburn in 1949. If you need somewhere to crash, book ahead to ensure you snag a room at the Leyburn Motel/Cabins over the road.
